The retiring champions, the Clef Dwellers, were on hand to crown their successors. President C. W. Coye paid a tribute to the Clef Dwellers for their conduct while holding the championship which they won at Grand Rapids last year.

DISTRICT CONVENTION: At the meeting of the delegates held at the Ypsilanti meeting, a new constitution was adopted for the District. It makes several changes in the District set-up. All Chapter secretaries have been furnished copies of it. Under the new plan, delegates' terms of office will begin July 1st. A House of Delegates has been provided. The Board of Directors will now consist of the ten Area Governors plus the six officers. This will provide for a more compact body. The Area Governors will

be elected at a caucus of their respective areas. The six District Officers will continue to constitute the District Executive Board.

MIDLAND AWARDED REGIONAL: Midland was awarded the 1950 International Regional Preliminary Quartet Contest by the

District Executive Board. It will be held on Saturday, May 6, 1950. Out of this will come the International semi-finalists for the contest at Omaha, Nebraska, the following month. The Clef Dwellers, Antlers, and Songmasters, second, third, and fourth place winners in the 1949 International contest at Buffalo will all be eligible to compete at Midland. Add to this the Gardenaires, finalists in International competition for the past several years, Midland's favorite sons, the Interludes, and several other up and coming younger quartets, and the Michigan Regionals will be watched by the whole country. Every Barbershopper in Michigan should plan now to be in Midland on May 6th. It is expected that the District's annual meeting will be held in conjunction with this event.

THURSDAY NOON AT DETROIT: Every Thursday Noon, Barbershoppers from various chapters in the Metropolitan area who happen to work or be in downtown Detroit, get together for a luncheon at 12:15 P.M. It is held at the Penobscot Club, which is located in the Penobscot Building right across from the Detroit City Hall. Lunches average \$1.10. Every member of SPEBSQSA and his friends are invited. We meet in a private dining room. Come in and ask for us. The place is nice, the food good, the price reasonable, the music sweet, and the fellows the finest in the land.
